Last year, a couple of friendly townspeople asked me if I would be willing to play Santa for a Christmas event. I think they thought it was both an honor and a good fit. Both looked a little shocked at how quickly I de-

clined. While I try to keep my opinion to myself (except when I blurt it out, unasked, in print like this), I'm not really a fan of the Jolly

Old Elf (in this article, hereafter referred to as J.O.E.). He's friendly, hardworking, generous, and nice; all qualities I admire, but he's also a distraction.

The word 'sleight' comes to mind. Sleight of hand is defined as "skill with the hands, especially in confusing or deceiving onlookers, as in magic." The hand is quicker than the eye, get them looking this way while you do something that way, replace one thing with another while people wonder how you did it. Keep your eyes on Christmas. Look. Keep watching. Don't take your eyes off. Poof! Christmas is about world peace and the spirit of giving, personified by J.O.E. How'd they do that?

Or, you can feel slighted. Different word, same sound. It means "insult (someone) by treating or speaking of them without proper respect or attention." It might be used in a sentence like this: "I felt slighted when my best friend didn't invite me to his party."

Somehow, sleight is involve in the slight when your best friend isn't invited to his own party. And in this case, it to His own party. Because if you're not careful, you the Bible-believing Church-going Christian

can look back at your Christmas day and wonder, 'How did that happen? I don't think Jesus was really part of my Christmas!'

The only example we have in the Bible is the first Christmas. Apparently it took a long time before people started celebrating it at all, let alone with the style and size we use today. But let's look at the one example we have.

In Matthew, we have Magi, a king, and a star. When the wise men found Jesus, "they fell to the ground and worshiped Him." In Luke we find an angel choir and shepherds. The first angel shared the good news with the shepherds, then he had company. "And suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest..." And as for the shepherds, after they saw the baby Jesus, they "went back, glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen..." The first Christmas

was all about God's glory and praise. Does your Christmas glorify Jesus? Or does it slight Him? Don't misunderstand me—you can still have trees and lights and gifts and special food—those things can be every bit as much a part of a legitimate celebration as a false one. You can even have J.O.E. In our house he was 'a fun pretend guy some people believe is real.' But be careful. Don't let anyone sleight you so that you slight Him.


