Preparing for Sunday School, where we were working our way through the first chapter of Ezekiel, I came across this description of the throne of God. "Now above the expanse that was over their heads there was something resembling a throne, like lapis lazuli in appearance." I typically read this to be something like: "...a throne, like \$%^%%##(&\$%

"...a throne, like \$%^%%##(&\$% in appearance." The words 'lapis lazuli' meant little to me. That has been forever changed.

Wanting to do due diligence, I did an internet search for lapis lazuli, and found it is a semi-precious mostly blue stone. Clicking on images, I was hammered by what I saw. I looked at a few images, to confirm, and in all of them I was looking at a blue stone with light brown spots and streaks. Then I typed in 'Earth seen from space,' and looked at a ball the same shape of blue, with similar light brown spots and streaks. Please, look it up yourself. It is a powerful comparison.

If that is the intended comparison, then earth serves as God's throne. Other passages come to mind. Solomon, when dedicating the temple, said, "Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain Thee; how much less this house which I have built?" (2 Chron 7:18). David, in Psalm 8 praised God this way: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man that you are him, the son of man that you care for him?"

Astronomers tell us we are a tiny planet circling a modest star in a distant arm of an

insignificant galaxy. Probably all true. But this is where God has set His throne.

There is more. In Exodus 24:10, Moses and the elders receive a vision of God, and the pavement below His feet is lapis lazuli. In Isaiah 54:11 and Revelation 21:19 we find it in the foundation of the New Jerusalem. It's a powerful picture.

But it is a picture with problems. First, instead of 'lapis lazuli,' many Bible translations read 'sapphire,' another blue stone, but very different. And after all, the Hebrew word is 'sappir.' The Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament clears that problem up like this. "That the people of biblical times did not understand the word to be ...modern sapphire, but lapis lazuli, the

rich, azure gem...seems probable." Another problem—the bigger issue, in my mind, is that the ability to see lapis lazuli as a representation of earth was hardly possible before our modern technical era, when someone was finally able to see earth from space. Today, I can type in "Earth seen from

Today, I can type in "Earth seen from space" and see an image. In 1969, astronauts were able to take a picture. In the history of the world before that? All this symbolism was missing. If I was inclined to doubt this symbolism, I would consider this argument compelling.

But maybe, God is giving a special blessing to we who live in these times. A reminder that this earth is His throne. He has chosen it, He blesses it, and He considers it, and us, special. God is here, and we will trust Him.


- Youth Leadership
