# A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

### Adornment not Necessary

I listen to sports radio out of desperation—in the desperate hope that someone can put a good spin on recent results. Sometimes I get what I want. But often, they're talking about something not sports-related at all.

The other day, I couldn't believe my ears when they were talking about a 'Cannabis Dispensary' next to a 'Waffle House.' They repeated both descriptions

several times. I wondered why the one wasn't a "Pot Shop' and the other a 'Breakfast Foods Dining Establishment.'

I didn't wonder much. Apparently someone thought describing a pot shop in respectable terms makes it a respectable place. I will go out on a limb here and say no terms you can find will turn it into a respectable place.

I think I'm in favor of plain speech. We could encourage each other to sojourn at the praise and exaltation facilities, but I'm more comfortable with going to church.

The first four verses of Luke are written in classical Greek; sophisticated, aimed for the more educated audience. The rest of the New Testament was written in Koine Greek. This could be understood as street Greek, or common Greek. It was written in plain English (if you'll pardon my French).

When Jerome translated the Bible into Latin, it was so the average man—because once the average man spoke Latin—could read the Bible. They called it the Vulgate because it was written in the vulgar language so the vulgar people could read it. When the King James Bible first came out, it was in the language of the common peo-

ple, who apparently were so classy they all spoke like Shakespeare. They were following the pattern of the original Bible writers—make God's Word plain so it can be plainly understood.

In that plainly written Word, we read such plainly written things as, "And when I came to you, brethren, I did not come with superiority of speech or of wisdom, proclaiming to you the testimony of God. For I de-

speech or of wisdom, proclaiming to you the testimony of God. For I determined to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and Him crucified. I was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling, and my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God" (1 Cor 2:1-5).

Paul quoting what others said about him, wrote, "they say 'His letters are weighty and strong, but his personal presence is unimpressive and his speech contemptible" (2 Cor 10:10).

Plain-spoken and unimpressive, but clear. And in that clarity the power of God is revealed

The truth, like true beauty, does not need adornment. We can simply say what it is, and in the simplest and plainest way we know, and it will only be more clear because of that.

I could say, 'So don't be afraid to speak God's truth,' but looking at what is written above, I'll say 'speak God's truth even if it is

with fear and trembling.' Because you don't have to be fancy, it is better to be plain


